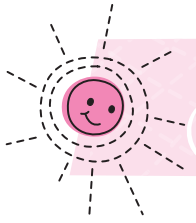

Eg: 123

- HUNDRED'S PLACE has 1 i.e. 1 hundred, i.e. Place value= 1×100 or 100
- TEN'S PLACE has 2 i.e. 2 tens i.e. Place value= 2×10 or 20
- ONE'S PLACE has 3 i.e. 3 ones i.e. Place value= 3×1 or 3
